Her pioneering action was largely responsible for the Curtiss Report and the Children's Act 1948. In making an annual award in her memory the trustees have tried to fulfil the spirit of adventure and enterprise instilled in all who worked with her.

GUIDANCE NOTES FOR APPLICATIONS TO THE TRUST

The Object of the Trust is to promote the welfare and education of children through the award of a travel grant to those whose proposed project will directly benefit their work with children.

Amount of award	Grants are in the region of £1000.00
Who may apply	People working with children and young people. The Trustees particularly welcome applications from those working with disabled and disadvantaged children.
What the Trustees CANNOT CONSIDER	Grants cannot be given for: Academic course fees Attendance at specific conferences Building and equipping centres Gap year / Sixth Form projects or similar travel proposals Medical electives Retrospective funding Supporting individual children
When to apply	Application forms are available on the website www.ladyallentrust.org or between May and December each year from the Hon Secretary. Awards are made in March the following year

- Closing date** The closing date for applications is **31st January** annually
- Successful candidates** Successful candidates are required to provide a typewritten account (about 2000 words) of the experience gained. This must be received by the trustees within six months of completion of travel.

Points to note when completing your form

1. Please type your answers if possible. If hand written please write clearly using black ink as these forms will be photocopied
2. Your application should clearly show your travel plans and how the experience will be used in your future work
3. Your outline proposal should be one side of the page only. Please note that a copy of this will be sent to your referees

SOME PROJECTS THAT HAVE WON AWARDS

- Award to a special needs teacher to visit North America to study social cognition in children with severe learning difficulties, with a view to including their methods in his school where the benefits are currently being assessed
- Award to a speech therapist from London to work with REACH in Calcutta, to extend her understanding of Indian life and culture and to develop materials which will help both hosts and her work at home
- Award to a non-government organisation (NGO) worker in Bangladesh to visit projects for deprived families in Thailand, with the intention of broadening his experience in order to develop in-service work on his return
- Award to a Great Ormond Street Hospital play specialist to study the psychological preparation of children and their families, where the child is in need of renal transplantation, in Ontario, Canada
- Award to an experienced teacher of children with hearing impairment to visit a school in Zaire to help with assessment of children's needs and the further development of a suitable curriculum for them.
